In a major boost to India – Africa relations, the Union Cabinet of India chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on 21st March, 2018, approved opening of new Indian Missions in 18 African countries. It was decided that these Missions will be opened over a four year period between 2018 and 2021. This decision was taken to enhance India's diplomatic outreach in the African continent and allow India to engage with Indian diaspora in African countries. Eswatini was part of this list of 18 African countries.

On April 9-10, 2018, the Hon'ble President of India made the first ever State Visit to the Kingdom of Eswatini on the invitation of His Majesty King Mswati III. He was accompanied by the First Lady, a Minister of State from Gujarat and some members of Parliament and senior officials of the Ministry of External Affairs.

One of the commitments made during the visit by the President of India and duly recorded in the Joint Communique issued at the end of the visit has been fulfilled with the establishment of the first resident High Commission of India in Mbabane which came into existence on 13th August, 2019 on assumption of charge by Ms Radha Venkataraman of the post of the High Commissioner of India to the Kingdom of Eswatini.

Then paid a visit to John Bosco Church to meet with the 3 Indian Sisters serving there for nearly two decades. New month! New adventures! High Commissioner presented her credentials to King Mswati III, administered the oath of integrity to HCI officials, launched the Lubuyane Irrigation Project at Maphalaleni with the Minister of Agriculture. That was not all!. The first ITEC & International Students Day was celebrated in Eswatini. It saw participation from nearly a hundred ITEC alumni with Min. of Foreign Affairs, Thuli Dladla as the Chief Guest. October also saw Mahatma Gandhi 's remembrance ceremony and Deepawali celebrations both organized by the Indian Community in the country led by Mrs Mona Ashraff. What an October it was!



















3 months had flown by and much had already been done. HCI Officials started grasping a few SiSwati words, got accustomed to the way Emaswati do things and started exploring the beautiful kingdom of Eswatini. The High Commissioner went on to being the Chief Guest at Good Shepherd's graduation ceremony in Siteki. Then 550th Anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji was celebrated with the Indian community in the country. Worth mentioning as well is Natural Resources Minister, Senator Peter Bhembe leading a team to India for a week and 5 Emaswati receiving full ITEC training scholarships in the same month. Then the Mission began it's process of acquiring services of local officials to assist in the Mission's day-to-day running. Thousands of applications were received. Interviews were to follow.













New Year, new beginnings. The Mission had found its footing by appointing five local staff members to join the High Commission Team. January looked to be another busy month that would precede the busy six months of 2019. The year 2020 started off with the Local Indian community celebrating Vishwa Hindi Diwas & Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas (International Hindi Day and International Day for Non Resident Indians) at the High Commission's office in the Royal Villas. January meant India would also celebrate its 70th Republic Day Anniversary. An open house - flag hoisting ceremony was held at the Residence of the High commissioner at Thembelihle where nearly 200 of the Indian diaspora joined to make it a grand success. That was followed by the evening Reception at the Royal Swazi Spa Hotel where several Ministers and Emaswati dignitaries along with the local Diplomatic Corps and large diaspora took Both TV stations and print media of Eswatini covered the celebrations and part. gave it wide publicity. High Commissioner was given an opportunity to join the monthly meeting of the PS' to make a presentation on ITEC training offered by India and she also attended the formal opening of the Eswatini Parliament held on 31st January, 2020.











Internationally dubbed the 'Month of Love', what better way to start off the month than a lovely familiarization visit by the Foreign Affairs Minister, Thuli Dladla and several MPs to the High Commission. The 1st set of passports were issued by the Mission to the Indian nationals living in Eswatini. Subsequently, for the first time, 7 Emaswati went to Surajkund International Crafts Bazaar in Haryana, India coupled with 15 that received full ITEC scholarships. Soon after, HRH Prince Hlangusempi visited Lucknow for the first Indian Africa Defence Ministers' Conclave where he also attended DEFEXPO2020. The High Commissioner made a presentation on the Indian Constitution at the Waterford School, Mbabane. Her attendance at the first Annual Marula Festival at Buhleni followed, where Emaswati gather to enjoy this beautiful drink with their King. The month was made perfect for the Mission by getting the Indian manufactured Mahindra XUV 500 as the Flag Car for the High Commissioner. The Mission soon hosted its 1st ever Indian Cultural Event at Bethel Court with the help of the local Indian community. The Month of Love was concluded with sharing love with children in the Kingdom by donating 200 solar lamps to 4 primary and secondary schools at Sithobela in the Lubombo region. Thus the Gandhi Global Solar Journey reached Eswatini too.































Marching on! The Mission moved to its permanent office in Mbabane at The UN Building. Soon after, the High Commissioner hosted a get together with the Emaswati participants at the Surajkund Mela. She then was the Guest of Honor at the Graduation of National Handicrafts Training Center. The Commonweath Day Reception Hosted by the British HC, Reception hosted by the EU Ambassador and Tourism Promotion Event at Mantenga Cultural Village were the other social engagements for the High Commissioner. The low key Holi celebrations with the Diaspora followed coupled with HOMs video conference with PM Modi. She called on HM King Mswati III to brief him on bilateral developments and met with Princes' Hlangusempi and Sicalo for a Defense Co-Operation meeting. Covid-19 infection cases started being recorded in the country and official lockdown was enforced by the Government. And the Mission had to work from home.













The Mission celebrated the International day of Yoga 2020 at the Embassy Residence with limited participation due to Covid-19 regulations. The event was covered by both TV Channels of Eswatini. Eswatini Observer and Times of Eswatini went on to publish the yoga event and the High Commissioner's article 'Celebrating International Day of Yoga'. A few days later, Eswatini TV's breakfast show hosted the High Commissioner to discuss the importance of yoga and how Emaswati can benefit from regularly practicing it. The Mission further on gifted Ministers, PS', Commissioner General of Correctional Services, Police Commissioner and others with pen drives containing significant information and videos on Yoga. HCI Mbabane collaborated with HCI Maputo and Foreign Ministry to repatriate stranded Indians in Eswatini through a charter flight taking back Indians from the Republic of Mozambique. Closing up June, the Mission donated India's humanitarian assistance of essential medicines to the value of E3m to the Kingdom. The medicines were received by the Hon. PM Mandvulo Dlamini himself in the company of Minister of Health, Lizzie Nkosi as well as other Ministers of the Government, at Central Medical Stores in Matsapha. Both Print and visual media gave wide coverage to the event.

365 days of HCIMbabane fast approaching! The Mission started off July by running an online quiz on Indian Constitution. This was in commemoration of the 70th Anniversary of the constitution. Efforts made by the Mission on disseminating information on Yoga proved to be fruitful as the Indian diaspora as well as local nationals continued to practice Yoga and shared videos with the Mission. The Mission congratulated Eswatini for her election by the United Nations general assembly to serve as Vice President of the 75th session of the General Assembly. ### India offers help to ailing Eswatini health sector

TEKI - Indian medical professionals have pledged support and commitment to improving the health sector in the country following the establishment of a fully-fledged Indian diplomatic Mission in Eswatini.

Delivering a keynote address during the Good Shepherd College graduation ceremony yesterday, Indian High Commissioner to Eswatini Radha Venkataraman stated that her country was 'ever willing to assist Eswatini' to meet her aspira-tions, which includes improving the health sector.

"Medical professionals from In-dia are willing to come here, even at their own expense, to conduct the required workshops for all concerned. Hospitals in India have offered to work together with medical institutions in Eswatini in capacity building training programmes," she stated. She further listed a litany of other areas where Indian healthcare professionals had pledged to support Eswatini.

They have pledged to help in running of primary health care centre,

setting up of diagnostic units, day care chemotherapy, day care dialysis centre, organising super speci-ality camps with specialist doctors, medical education sessions and pro-gramme," said Venkataraman.

She further stated that other medical professionals in her country wanted to help in revamping exist-ing medical facilities in Eswatini. She said this would be done through collaborations with Eswatini gov-

collaborations with Eswatini gov-ernment and private institutions.
"Many companies in India wish to supply pharmaceutical products to Eswatini, (they) want to establish collaborative partnerships in the health care domain for referral to Indian Hospitals for high end sur-geries and transplants," stated the Ambassador. Ambassador.

She thanked the college administration for inviting her to the event despite that she only presented her credentials to His Majesty the King on October 14, 2019.

She further praised Indian nationals who are working at Good Shepherd Mission Hospital, mainly as doctors.
